## REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS - NGO FUNDING 2023/24-2024/25

The national Department of Health invites national NGOs, i.e. NGOs that have operations in three or more provinces, to apply for funding to strengthen service delivery in four priority areas as outlined in the Negotiated Service Delivery Agreement (NSDA) of the Department of Health. The four priority areas in the NSDA are: improving life expectancy; combating HIV & AIDS; reducing the burden of disease from TB and strengthening of the health system effectiveness.

In line with the national strategy to expand service coverage and reach most at risk and under serviced communities, groups and individuals, the focus of our funding will be targeted at expanding coverage of areas with high HIV and high TB burden aimed at supporting the department to reach the 95, 95, 95 Surge Plan targets. The programme design in the proposals must comprehensively be Prevention Strategies that maximize equitable and equal access to HIV, TB and STIs and solutions:

- Increase knowledge, attitudes and behaviours that promote HIV and TB prevention.
- Reduce new HIV infections by optimizing the implementation of high impact HIV prevention interventions.
- Promote elimination of Mother-to-Child Transmission of HIV.
- To ensure that 95% of People Living with HIV especially Key Populations and Priority Populations on HIV, TB, Viral hepatitis and STI know their status.
- Strengthen HIV and TB prevention interventions for Key and Priority Populations.

To be considered favorably, applicants must be able to illustrate prior experience and willingness to generate maximum impact with the lowest possible use of resources.

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

**NB: Applicants not meeting eligibility criteria will not be considered for formal assessment and subsequent funding. The department reserves the right not to enter-into correspondence regarding unsolicited proposals and unsuccessful applicants.**

- All proposals/applications should reach the Department before the stipulated Closing Date.
- All proposals for funding must be done using the Department's application forms.
- All sections of the application form must be fully and comprehensively completed.
- All proposals must illustrate how the proposed activities will contribute to national, provincial and district priorities.
- All NGOs must produce documented proof of their NPO certificate, which will be verified for validity with the Department of Social Development (DSD).
- Applicants must comply with the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) to ensure sound financial management and accounting.

### HOW TO APPLY:

**The following documents are required from applicants who wish to be considered for funding:**

- Application form which is obtainable from National Department of Health Dr A B Xuma Building, 1112 Voortrekker RD, Pretoria Townlands 351-Jr) and website: [www.health.gov.za](http://www.health.gov.za).
- Proposal: Business plan detailing schematic plan and proposed budget (template available on the department's website).
- Certified copy of certificate of registration under the Non-Profit Organizations Act of 1997.
- Certified copy of tax clearance certificate.
- Copy of the NGO's constitution and financial policy signed by board members.

- Names of Board Members, ID numbers and personnel profiles including details of work teams employed by the NGO.
- Audited financial statements for the most recent year that the organization has been in existence.
- Details of other sources of funding, including amounts and areas of focus for the past financial period (as requested in application form).

**Note:**

All applicants must ensure that they have presented their proposals to Provincial Departments of Health for endorsement and support. **A written confirmation will be required in this regard as proof that the province supports your proposed interventions and intends to support your projects.** The table below lists names and contact details of Provincial Managers that you should consult with:
