

GNR.911 of 28 September 2001: Regulations governing certain solvents in foodstuffs

The Minister of Health has, in terms of [section 15 \(1\)](#) of the Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Act, 1972 (Act [No. 54 of 1972](#)), made the regulations in [the Schedule](#).

SCHEDULE

1. In these regulations “the Act” means Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Act, 1972 (Act [No. 54 of 1972](#)), made the regulations in this Schedule—

“**beverage**” means any powder or liquid intended for sale as a drink for human consumption, and shall include natural mineral water and bottled water.

2. For the purpose of [section 2 \(1\) \(b\) \(i\)](#) of the Act, in so far as it is applied to and is applicable to foodstuffs, the following foodstuffs are hereby deemed to be contaminated or impure:

- (a) Any beverage containing more than 10mg per kilogram of benzene in the ready to drink form.
- (b) Any liquor product exceeding the specified maximum level of methanol as stipulated for different liquor products under the Liquor Products Act, 1989 (Act [No. 60 of 1989](#)).
